|  | 7 | - Child shows functioning expected for his or her age in all or almost all everyday situations that are part of the child's life. <br> - No one on the team has concerns about the child's functioning in this outcome area. |
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|  | 6 | - Child's functioning generally is considered appropriate for his or her age, but there are some significant concerns about the child's functioning in this outcome area. <br> - Although age-appropriate, the child's functioning may border on not keeping pace with age expectations. |
|  | 5 | - Child shows functioning expected for his or her age some of the time and/or in some settings and situations. <br> - Child's functioning is a mix of age-expected and not age-expected behaviors and skills. <br> - Child's functioning might be described as like that of a slightly younger child. |
|  | 4 | - Child shows occasional age-appropriate functioning across settings and situations. <br> - More functioning is not age-expected than age-expected. |
|  | 3 | - Child does not yet show functioning expected of a child of his or her age in any situation. <br> - Child uses immediate foundational skills most or all of the time across settings and situations. <br> - Functioning might be described as like that of a younger child. |
|  | 2 | - Child occasionally uses immediate foundational skills across settings and situations. <br> - More functioning reflects skills that are not immediate foundational than are immediate foundational. |
|  | 1 | - Child does not yet show functioning expected of a child his or her age in any situation. <br> - Child's functioning does not yet include immediate foundational skills upon which to build age-appropriate functioning. <br> - Child's functioning might be described as like that of a much younger child. |
