- When you finished reading, return to the questions. Read each answer choice and choose the best answer.

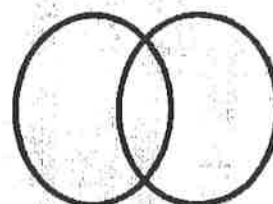
