

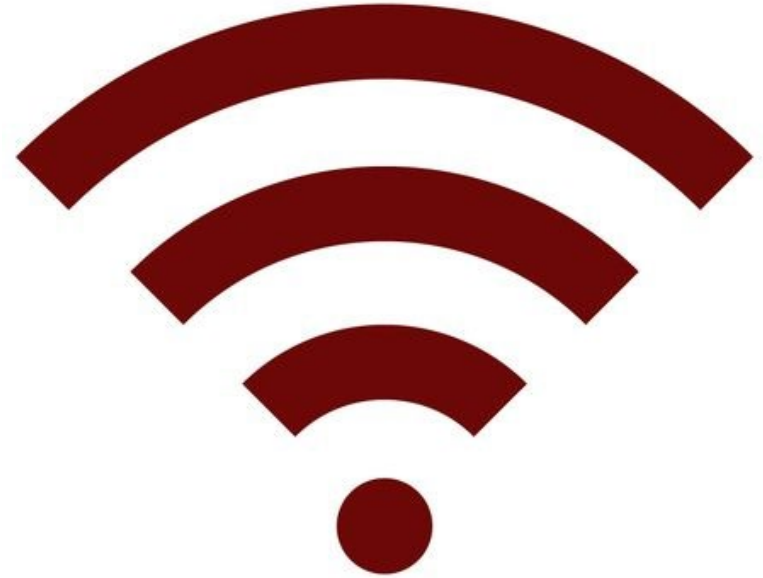

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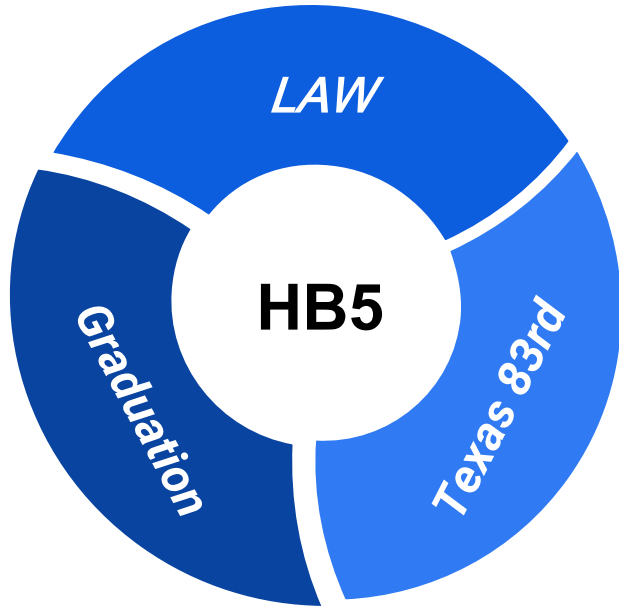

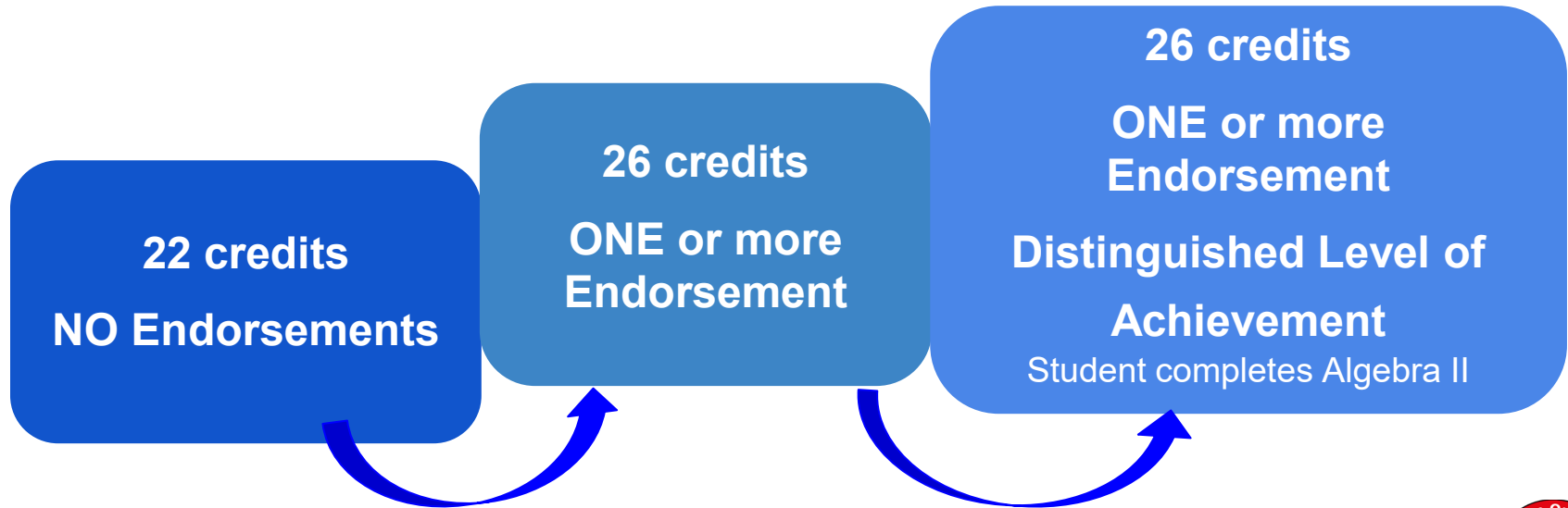
House Bill 5

Texas Records Exchange (TREx)

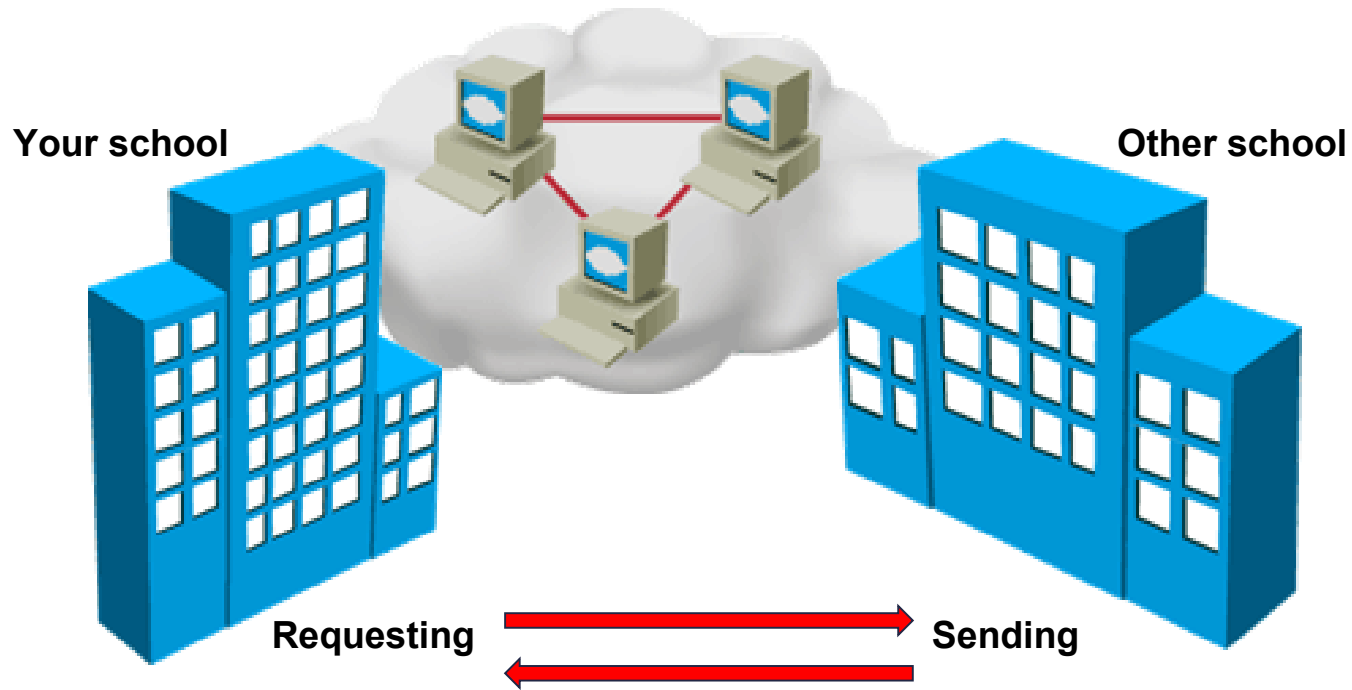
A web-based software application designed for the exchange of electronic student records. High school registrars and counselors also have the capability to electronically create and send official student **transcripts** to Texas public colleges and universities.



NOTE:

Once you send a request for records from a school, the requestor has **10 days** to reply to a request for records.

NGS and MSIX



NGS is a database used in Texas to communicate demographic, educational, and health data on migrant students to educators throughout the nation. Other states who use NGS are Wisconsin, Ohio, Delaware, Illinois and Minnesota.



MSIX was created in 2007, by the Office of Migrant Education (OME). It is a national database that links states' migrant student record to facilitate the national exchange of migrant students' educational and health information among the states.

NOTE: Both systems are secure and can only be used by people working with migrant students.



Timely records exchange

Students may come without any withdrawal information. For the timely enrollment of students you can:

- Use MSIX to make data requests

Scenario 1

What can migrant advocates do for Marlisa?



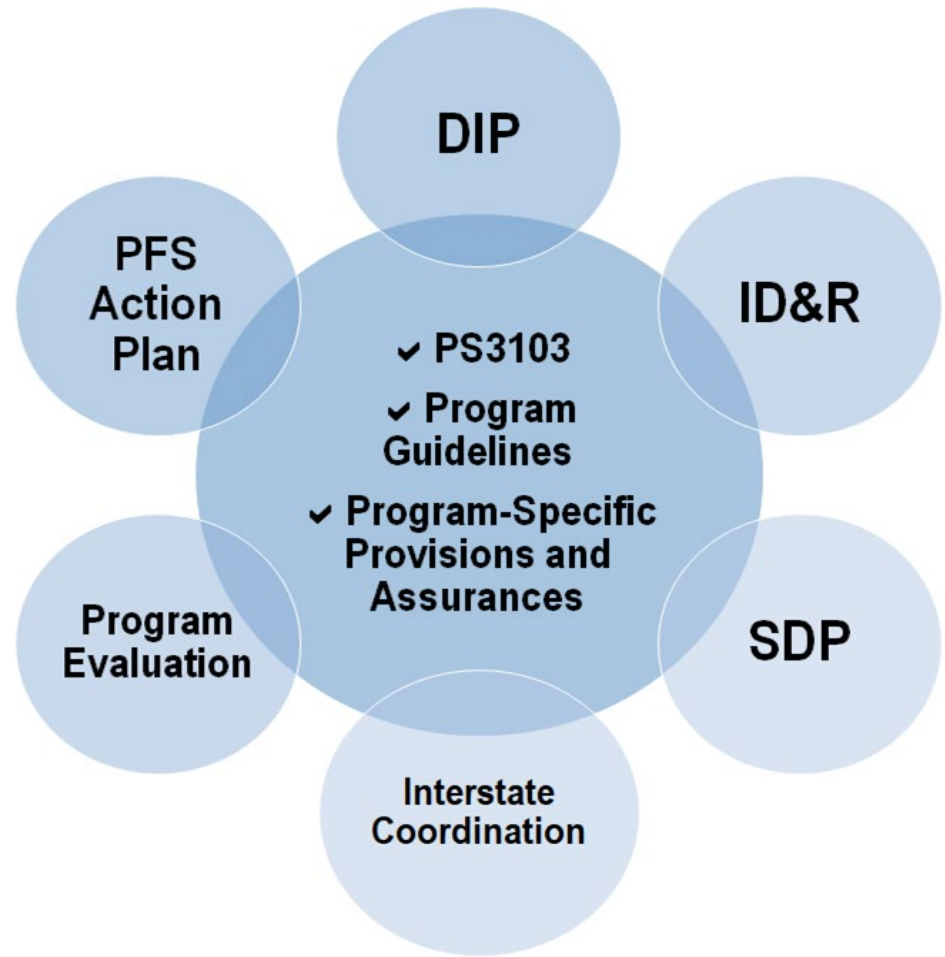
