
If the purpose of the conversation is to . . . **Build Up an Idea Together**

- 1. Express an idea, or ask others to express one.
- 2. Clarify the idea, or ask others for clarification.
- 3. Support the idea, or ask others to support it using reasons, evidence, examples, and explanations.



An idea can be many things:


- an opinion •

- a way to solve a problem •




If the purpose of the conversation is to ... Choose the Strongest Idea or Opinion
