Hands on Learning: Sample Scoring Guide

For each area determine level of child's skill:

- B. *Emerging*: The child is beginning to understand what needs to be done but hasn't completely mastered the skill yet. S/he can do at least one of the examples or something similar, but only with one or two sets of materials, and may be inconsistent.
- C. *Not Present:* The child does not seem to understand what needs to be done and doesn't attempt to perform this skill.
