Dual Credit Defined

ELIGIBILITY

Students receive credit for both High School and College credit.




South Texas College Enrollment: Fall 1993 - Spring 2023



Dual Credit Sections Academic & CTE: Fall 2002 - Spring 2023







Success Metrics Workshops





- The College offers Student Success Metrics Workshops for interested ISDs throughout the year.
- The goal is to collaborate with ISD partners to develop targeted or comprehensive interventions to improve districts' dual credit student performance in college-level courses.
- Workshops have been scheduled with partnering school districts and those districts in unsatisfactory status.





Interlocal Agreement Student Enrollment & Support Services

Advising

-TX SB 25 (2019) and TX SB 1324 (2019), which collectively address measures public institutions of higher education must take to facilitate successful transfer, academic progress, and timely graduation through, among other things, the filing of degree plans at certain milestones and the publication of course sequences.
- TX SB 1277 (2021), including but not limited to designating at least one employee from either institution to provide academic advising to each student who enrolls in a dual credit course before beginning the course.

Dual Credit Sections

- Dual credit sections assigned to an STC Faculty and/or Dual Credit Faculty must have a minimum of:
 - Ten (10) students enrolled in Academic sections and
 - Seven (7) in Career Technical Education sections
- Dual credit sections with less than the minimum enrollment will be cancelled by the advertised semester deadline.



Interlocal Agreement Financial Support Services

Faculty Charges

- School Districts cannot cancel dual credit courses with assigned College Faculty after August 8, 2022 (Fall 2022 semester), January 9, 2023 (Spring 2023 semester), May 22, 2023 (Summer I semester), and June 28, 2023 (Summer II).
- Should a School District cancel dual credit course(s) with an assigned College Faculty after the advertised deadline, a Late Dual Credit Section Cancellation Fee will be assessed.



Interlocal Agreement Support Services

Starfish

- College and Dual Credit Faculty teaching dual credit courses are required to check their class
 rosters during the first week of classes by accessing Starfish through JagNet to make sure that all
 students attending the class are enrolled in the dual credit course and are required to refer any
 students not on the roster to the appropriate School District counselor and the Dual Credit
 Enrollment Services Department.
- STC Faculty will provide the following Starfish Early Alert Surveys:
 - Fall 2023 and Spring 2024: First Week Attendance Verification, and two Progress Surveys (Weeks 5-6 & Weeks 11-12)
 - Summer 2024: First Week Attendance Verification, and one Progress Survey (Week 3)



Interlocal Agreement Counseling & Student Accommodations

Counseling & Student Accommodations

- The School District will **provide classroom accommodations for dual credit students**. If the class is taught at the high school by a high school Dual Credit Faculty, the School District's high school will be responsible to provide the classroom accommodations.
- If the class is taught by a College Faculty at the high school, the College
 Counselor will coordinate class accommodations with the high school Special
 Education Counselor.
- The School District will be responsible for implementing policies and procedures to enable students to identify disability needs and to provide academic accommodations for dual credit students.
- Students are not eligible to receive and/or otherwise utilize Individual Education Plans (IEP's) in Dual Credit courses.





Faculty Reporting Requirements

- Reporting Required Critical Student Performance Information
- STC Faculty
 - Will only provide the School District with final course numeric grades, based on a standard 100-point scale upon the School District's request. Such requests must be submitted by the School District to the STC Faculty by the Friday before the end of the beginning of the College's finals exams week.
 - Will not be required to submit midterm course grade



Faculty Expectations

As indicated in the Principal Agreement, STC Faculty teaching dual credit courses will:

- Contact the school when planning to be absent or delayed to class;
- Allow students to be absent for school-required state exams without penalty;
- Not remove/drop any student from the course without notifying a school official;
- Implement and utilize Starfish Early Alert for student retention and success.
- Provide critical student information when needed for high school reporting as allowed by FERPA rules and as stated in the Guidance Letter for Reporting Requirements as published in the *Dual Credit Programs Instructional and Quality Standards Manual*.



Textbooks

- DCF are expected to use **approved textbooks** as reflected in the Dual Credit Textbook Adoption List during the dual credit course.
- The Dual Credit Textbook Adoption list is **reviewed and updated annually** by College Department Chairs and lists the textbooks, lab manuals, and supplemental materials approved for use in Dual Credit courses. These are the adoptions supported by the IA, and any exceptions should be discussed and agreed upon by the School District, the College Department Chair, and the Dean of Dual Credit Programs and School District Partnerships
- The College will consider the use of **free or low-cost open educational resources** in courses offered under the program for School District.

Textbooks

- According to the established IA, College-approved textbooks purchased by the school district, as required for a college course, are allowed to be used for four (4) years. Department Chairs may request a change of textbook earlier than four (4) years, if the textbook is for a technology-based course, or with reasonable justification.
- A new textbook adoption needs to be communicated by the STC Department Chair to STC's Dual Credit Programs by the 1st of March of each year.

- Address any concerns regarding students
- Contact Dual Credit Programs Staff when problems arise or with concerns
 - Refer to the High School Code & ISD Contact List
- Communicate Issues and/or Concerns with Department Chair

Classroom Resources/Facilities

- Textbook, Access cards and Materials first class day
- Absences/Substitutes/FMLA



Faculty Expectations

Roster Verification

- Attendance vs. enrollment: Review Rosters
- Utilize Starfish Portal
- Setup instructor Starfish profile and encourage students do so as well
- Key Calendar Dates: Census, Withdrawal, Grade Submission

- Know your Dual Credit Programs
 Staff Contact
- Variation in ISD Calendars
 - Dual Credit Courses begin August 28
 - Must adhere to STC Calendar
- Create a college going culture





COVID Protocols



Dual Credit Student:

- A Dual Credit Student who may have been exposed or has tested positive for a communicable disease, should complete the <u>Student Communicable Disease Reporting Form</u>.
- During the exclusion period determined by the district, the assigned STC Faculty and/or Dual Credit Faculty must provide the course material for the dual credit student via the approved College's Learning Management System, Blackboard.



COVID Protocols

- <u>Dual Credit Faculty and STC Faculty assigned to teach Dual Credit Courses</u>:
 - All Dual Credit Faculty and STC Faculty must have successfully completed the STC Distance Learning Certification(s) in compliance with STC Policy 3111 and Policy 4411 regarding Faculty Readiness for Instructional Continuity.
 - Prior to first class day, Dual Credit Faculty and STC Faculty will ensure that their Blackboard Course Shell is updated with the required course material for the Fall 2022 dual credit courses.
 - Should it be determined that a dual credit student must adhere to an exclusion period, course material must be provided via the approved College's Learning Management System, Blackboard.
 - A Dual Credit Faculty or STC Faculty who may have been exposed or has tested
 positive for a communicable disease, should complete the <u>Employee</u>
 <u>Communicable Disease Reporting Form</u>.



COVID Protocols

Should a Dual Credit Faculty or STC Faculty be **unable to teach**, **course arrangements** must be made by contacting the South Texas College **Department Chair** prior to an absence. In accordance with STC Policy, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and Accreditation requirements, please be advised of the following procedures:

- **Dual Credit Faculty Absence** The Department Chair must approve any substitute, and the substitute's documentation forwarded to the Academic Dean.
- **STC Faculty Absence** The Department Chair will communicate with the Dean for Dual Credit Programs regarding an approved substitute, which will be provided for the partnering school district.



ISD Security Measures

Effective November 2022

- The Texas Education Agency (TEA) released a proposed school safety standards for all K-12 public schools in the state.
- After the **<u>Uvalde school shooting</u>**, Governor Greg Abbott charged TEA with creating rules to ensure a minimum level of safety on Texas school campuses.
 - All exterior <u>doors</u>, exterior classroom doors, and portable doors "should operate as fully intended" and are required to remain closed, latched, and locked, and "allow for emergency egress from the inside while remaining locked."
 - As an exception, the proposed rule states doors can be unlocked during the instructional day if they are "actively monitored or within a secured area."

Please advise Faculty changes to district protocols may occur thus, communication with District Contacts is essential to ensure we support their compliance measures.
