• **Bronfenbrenner**'s Ecological system theory and child's environment

• **Microsystem** - contains the structures with which the individual has direct contact

• **Mesosystem** - provides the connection between the structures of the child's microsystem

• Exosystem - defines the larger social system in which the child does not function directly

• Macrosystem - is comprised of cultural values, customs, and laws. The effects of larger principles defined by the macrosystem have a cascading influence

Social Capital

Pierre Bourdieu (1985) "Social capital" is defined as the capital or resources we gain from existing within a social network.

Social capital is the social ties that we develop throughout our lives.

Why is SC important?

- Helps reduce workplace conflict
