
WHATIS COLLEGE, CAREER, MILITARY READY?



Students who have acquired the knowledge, skills, and qualifications necessary to successfully transition into postsecondary education, the workforce, or the military after high

College Ready

- Meeting academic benchmarks for college admissions (e.g., SAT, ACT, or state assessments)
- Completing advanced coursework (e.g., AP, IB, or dual credit classes)
- Demonstrating proficiency in college-level reading, writing, and math
- Earning industry-recognized credentials that align with college pathways



Career Ready

- Gaining workplace skills and competencies through Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs
- Earning industry certifications or credentials
- Completing internships, apprenticeships, or job-shadowing experiences
- Developing problem-solving, communication, and teamwork skills that employers value




Military Ready


Everyone stand up against the wall and stand next to each other...

POL - Oral Board Interview






Develop Soft Skills & Character

Mock Trial

Mock trial prepares students for college, careers, and military service by developing essential skills such as critical thinking, public speaking, teamwork, and leadership



- Students learn to analyze legal cases, evidence, and arguments,
- Public Speaking: Arguing cases in front of judges and juries builds confidence in oral communication.
- Rese research skills and persuasive writing—both crucial in college essays and debates.
