### Partnership with Brownsville ISD

- Automatic acceptance of students graduating within the top 25% of their respective classes from school district
- University will contact school district counselors to notify them of scholarship opportunities available to school district graduates as such opportunities become available.
- University may provide financial aid, admissions, and degree counseling; work study mentorships; peer mentoring; and related support. Specific activities are subject to further discussion by the parties and the availability of necessary resources.
- School district shall promote the availability of the opportunity described in section I to all its students, parents, and community stakeholders, and shall specifically inform each qualifying student of the opportunity for automatic admission to university upon submission of application



### **CJ Summer Camp 2025**

- Designed for students aged 15-17 years of age who are interested in criminal justice, forensic science, security studies or victimology.
- Four days. Students arrive on a Sunday afternoon and leave on Thursday afternoon.
- Students stay in a residence hall on campus, and all meals are provided by the camp.
- Students will have the opportunity to meet with criminal justice professionals, including SHSU Alumni, from various agencies, including but not limited to the FBI, DEA, U.S. Marshals, and Texas State Troopers. Tours to the Harris County Fire Marshals Office, Montgomery County Morgue and Walker County Jail are also provided.

## **Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences (BAAS)**

Associates of Applied Arts and Sciences (AAS) in a technical area with at least 42 hours of coursework. Upon acceptance, students must complete the core classes and a minor area of study including at least 36 hours of advanced coursework (300-400 level). To be admitted and approved for the BAAS degree program students must be advised by the BAAS program coordinator.

## **Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences (BAAS)**

To be eligible one of the following is required:

- Earned and received an Associate of Applied Arts and Sciences (AAS) in a technical area with at least 36 hours of coursework.
- Portfolio documenting National Union apprenticeship and 5 yrs of work experience
- Portfolio documenting 2000 hrs of professional development and ten yrs of work experience









- Semester fees apply.
- Be employed as a Peace Officer by the state of Texas or by a political subdivision of Texas
- Provide a copy of your employee ID that shows you are a Peace Officer
- Provide the university Registrar proof of employment as a currently paid Police Officer (required each semester in which the exemption will be used) in the form of a letter on letterhead dated within 30 days of application that you are a Peace Officer, or provide a copy of pay stub within 30 days of application.
- Submit completed Registrar's <u>Application for Texas Peace Officer</u> and <u>Firefighters Exemption</u> each semester

#### Eligible courses:

• Only undergraduate courses pertaining to **Criminal Justice** are eligible for the tuition and laboratory fees exemption.
