# **STAAR Online Testing Practice Tests and 2017 Updates**

- 1. To access any of the 2016 released <u>online</u> STAAR assessments, you must first download/install the STAAR online testing platform to the device you are using. I have created a bit.ly link that will take you straight to the download/install page: <a href="http://bit.ly/staaronline">http://bit.ly/staaronline</a>. Download/install the link for the device you are using.
- 2. Once you have installed the platform, you will see the following icon:



- 3. Double-click on the icon and your computer will be secured to enter the testing platform.
- 4. Select the **Practice** tab
  - a. Enter the grade level and content area (or EOC and content area)
  - b. Select the test type
    - i. **STAAR A** STAAR test with embedded accommodations
    - ii. **STAAR L** STAAR test with embedded language accommodations
    - iii. **STAAR SOA** STAAR Standard Oral Administration this is STAAR with the text-to-speech accommodation only
    - iv. **STAAR** online version of STAAR test with no embedded accommodations (only available for EOCs)
    - v. Note the STAAR A tests have the text-to-speech feature embedded
- 5. The tests are the full released STAAR tests from last year, in the same format as they were during 2016 testing.
- 6. There are a few new features that will be available for 2017 testing that will not be available on these released tests, including:
  - a. Reading (through text-to-speech) of the pop-ups and rollovers
  - Reading (through text-to-speech) of the revising passages on the writing tests
  - c. This year, the 3<sup>rd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade STAAR tests can all be taken in the online format with no embedded accommodations



## 2017 STAAR Online Testing Information

- Every online test will have certain tools available to all users. These are called <u>Accessibility</u>
  <u>Features</u>
- 2. The embedded accommodations available through STAAR A, STAAR L, and STAAR SOA last year, will now be available as <u>personal needs and preferences (PNPs)</u>. These accommodations are now called <u>designated supports</u> and are divided into 3 categories; <u>Oral Administration (text-to-speech)</u>, <u>Content Supports</u>, <u>and Language & Vocabulary Supports</u>. Each of these has eligibility criteria. I am pasting some information from the TEA Student Assessment website about each below:

#### • Oral Administration (text-to-speech)

## Description of Accommodation

This accommodation, or designated support, allows test material to be read aloud to a student. All references to reading support during an oral administration also apply to signing during a signed administration. In addition, an online oral administration is administered via text-to-speech.

## Student Eligibility Criteria

A student may use this accommodation if he or she

- routinely and effectively uses this accommodation during classroom instruction and classroom testing, and
- meets at least one of the following:
  - · The student is a current ELL.
  - The student is identified with dyslexia or a related disorder per TEC §38.003.
  - · The student has documented evidence of reading difficulties.
- For students qualifying for Oral Administration only, the STAAR SOA practice tests will help students and teachers understand the online text-to-speech tool.

#### Content Supports

## **Description of Accommodation**

This accommodation, or designated support, allows for scaffolded directions, assistance with tracking, visual aids, and various graphic organizers to support a student's understanding of tested content.

## Student Eligibility Criteria

A student may use this accommodation if

- instructional and assessment decisions are made by an LPAC, Section 504 committee, or ARD committee, and
- he or she routinely, independently, and effectively uses this accommodation during classroom instruction and classroom testing
- For students qualifying for content supports, the <u>STAAR A</u> practice tests will help students and teachers understand the online pop-up and rollover tools.

# Language & Vocabulary Supports

## **Description of Accommodation**

This accommodation, or designated support, allows for simplified language, simpler sentence structure, and graphic representations of vocabulary and concepts to support a student's understanding of selections, test questions, and answer choices.

## **Student Eligibility Criteria**

A student may use this accommodation if

- instructional and assessment decisions are made by an LPAC, Section 504 committee, or ARD committee, and
- he or she routinely, independently, and effectively uses this accommodation during classroom instruction and classroom testing
- For students qualifying for language & vocabulary supports, the <u>STAAR A</u> and <u>STAAR L</u> practice tests will help students and teachers understand the online pop-up and rollover tools.
