


Social Justice Leadership

Social justice leadership has "no fixed or predictable meanings (Bogotch, 2002, p. 153). It is elusive, politically charged and truly open to numerous interpretations.



Social justice educational leadership emphasizes the belief that <u>all</u> <u>students</u> can and will reach proficiency, without exceptions or excuses, and that schools ought to be organized to advance the equitable learning of all students. The scholarship of social justice supports the notion that **educational** leaders have a social and moral <u>obligation</u> to foster equitable school practices, processes, and **outcomes** for learners of different racial, socioeconomic, gender, cultura disability, and sexual orientations backgrounds (Jean-Marie et al., 2009).




