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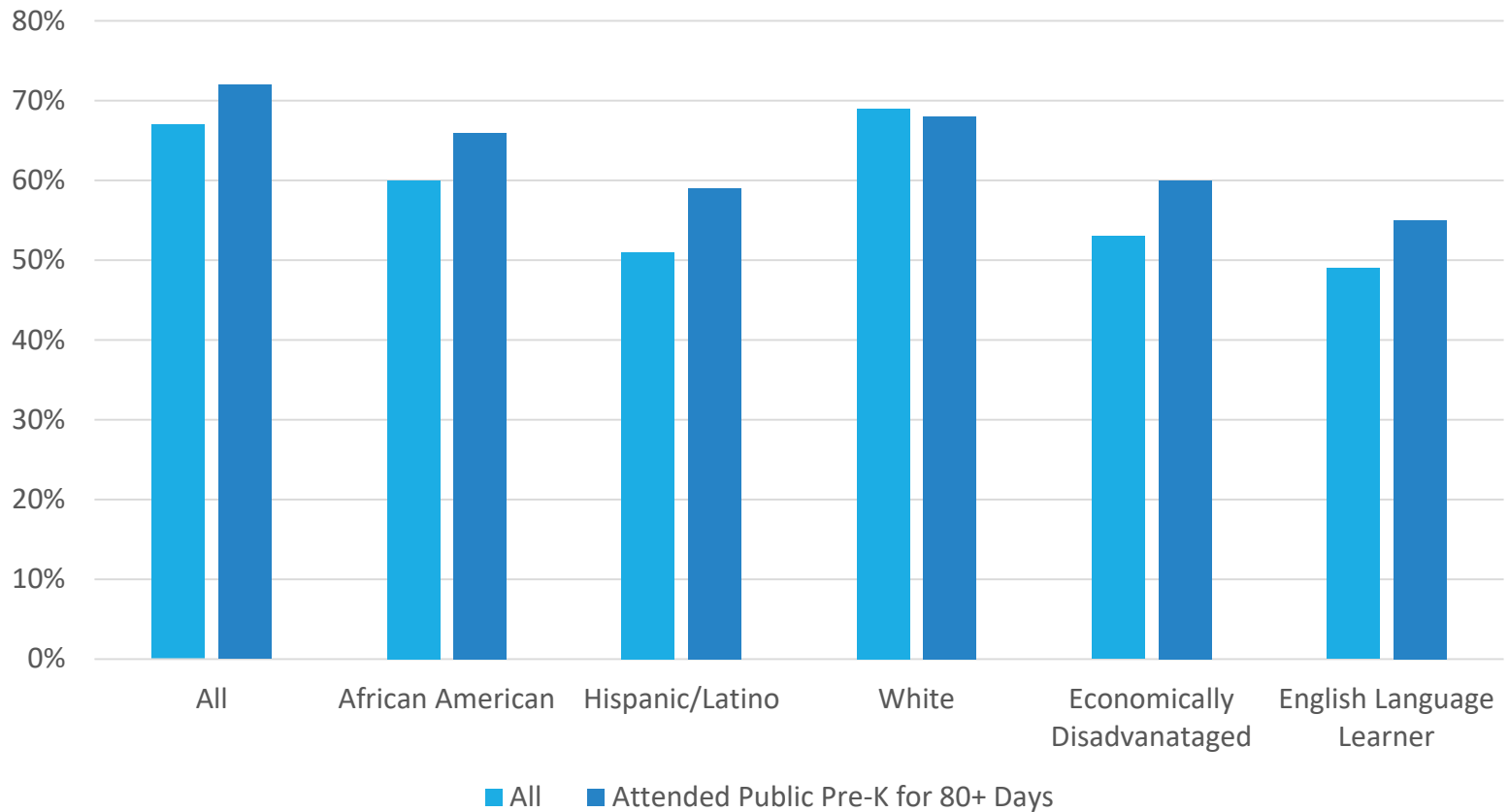

2015-2016 Kindergarten Readiness Data, TPEIR



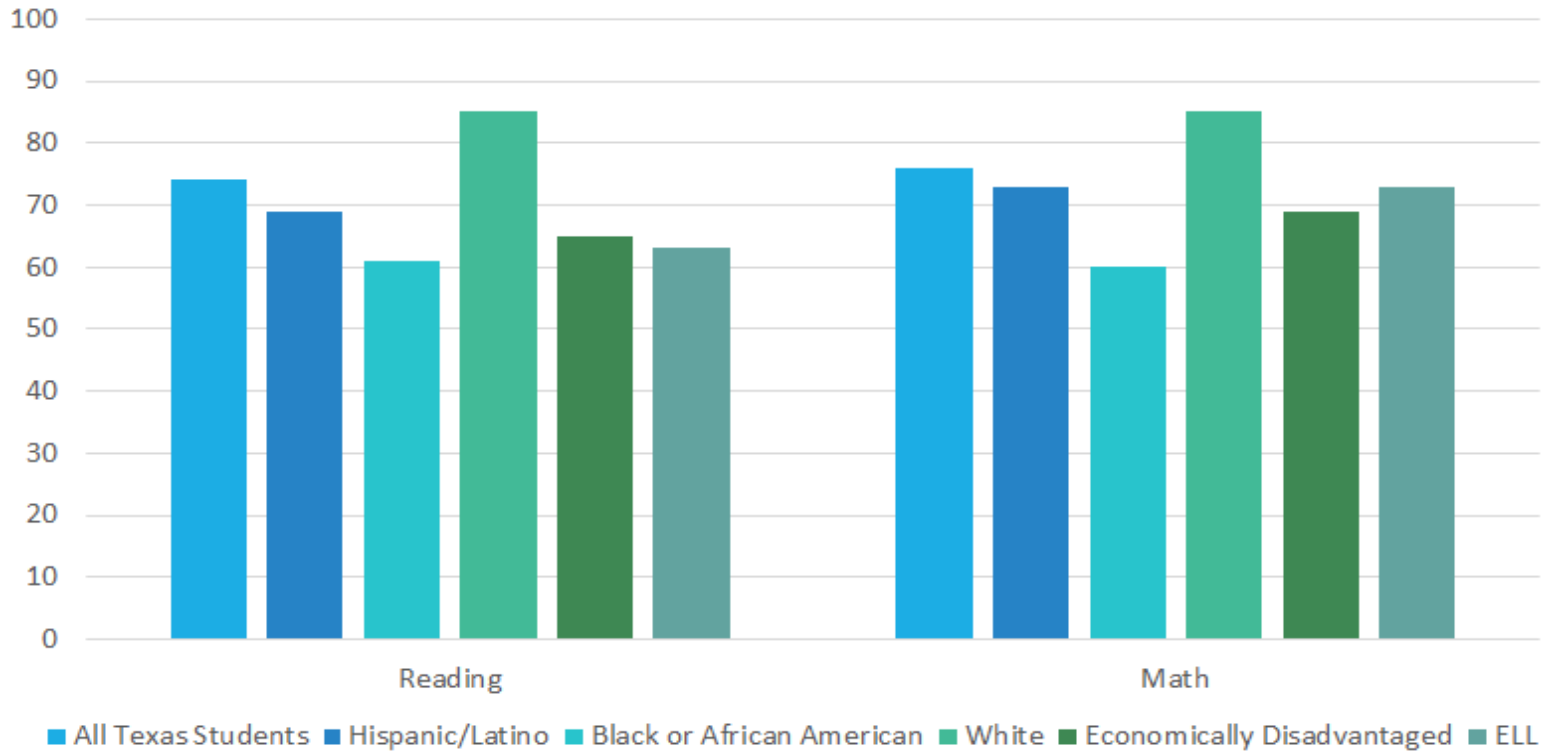

At or Above Standards





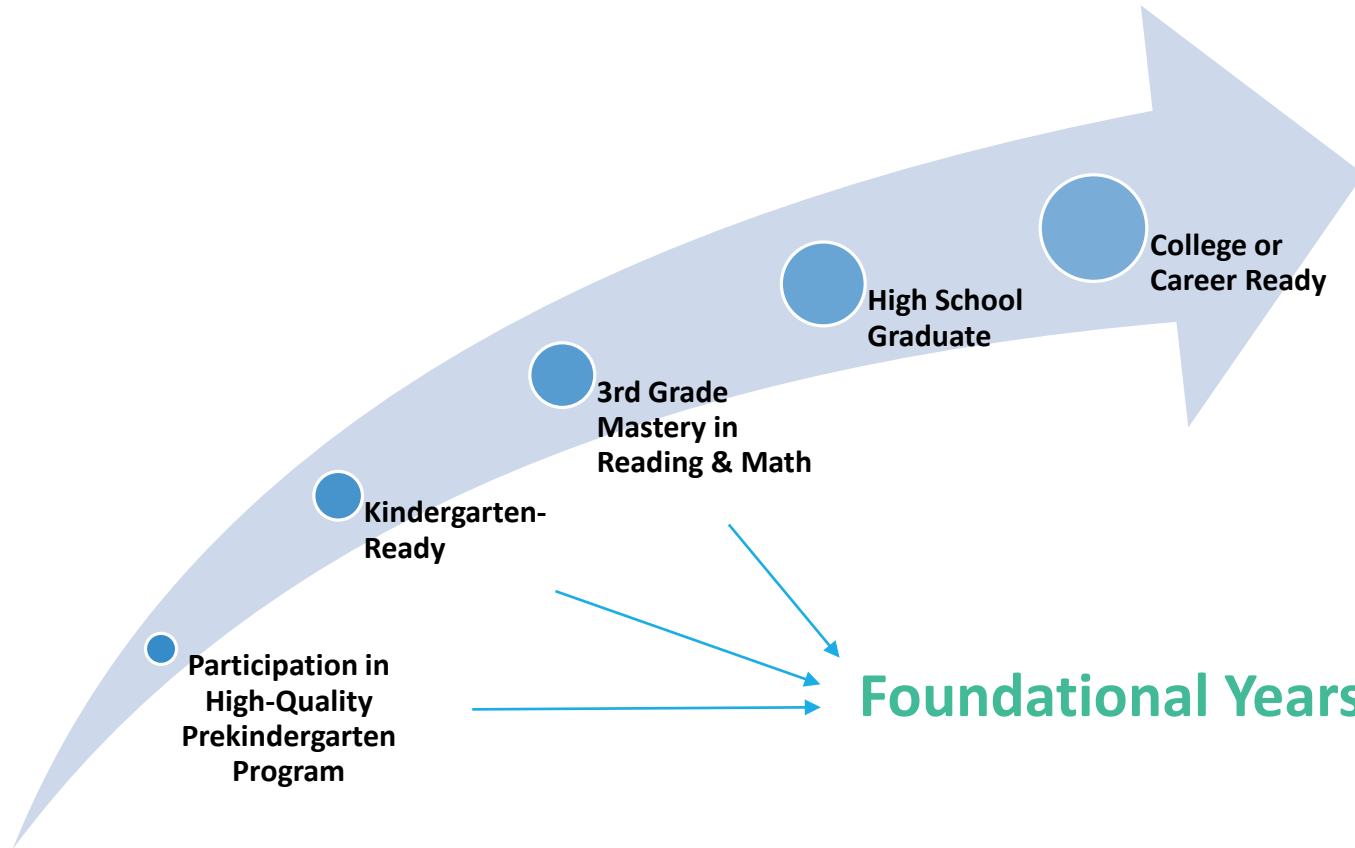

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# Emphasis on High-Quality

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Children from low-income homes in particular benefit from preschool education in comparison with their peers from high-income homes. However, the magnitude of the benefits depends on the quality of the program: On average, due to the prevalence of low-quality preschool programs, preschool in the U.S. narrows the achievement gap by perhaps only 5% rather than the 30% to 50% that research suggests might be possible on a large scale if all preschool programs were of higher quality.

# Changing Landscape: HQPG to Rider 78

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## ➤ 84<sup>th</sup> Legislature

- High-Quality Prekindergarten Grant (HQPG) passed and signed by Governor Abbott
- 573 Districts/Charters participated
- 118 million dollars was appropriated

## ➤ 85<sup>th</sup> Legislature

- Funding not appropriated for continuation of HQPG
- General Appropriations Act, Article III, Rider 78 passed and signed by Governor Abbott

## Article III, Rider 78

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*FSP Formula Funding for High-Quality Prekindergarten Programs. Included in amounts appropriated above in Strategy A.1.1, FSP - Equalized Operations, is an estimated \$1,580 million in the 2018-19 biennium for formula funding entitlement for pre kindergarten programs. Of this amount, the Commissioner shall ensure that school districts and charter schools receiving these funds shall use not less than 15 percent of their entitlement, an estimated \$236 million statewide, to implement prekindergarten consistent with the requirements of a High-Quality Prekindergarten program, as established in Education Code, §§29.167 - 29.171, and consistent with the provisions of Education Code, Chapters 41 and 42.*

# What does it mean?

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In simpler language:

The Commissioner is to ensure that at least 15% of prekindergarten FSP funds of each school district and charter school are used to implement high-quality prekindergarten components.

# Does Rider 78 apply to your program?

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Yes, if:

- You are a school district or charter school
- You serve 4-year-old children who are eligible for free prekindergarten
- You receive FSP funding from Texas to operate



# What does the 15% refer to?

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- Existing funding - not additional funding
- Foundation School Program (FSP)
  - Eligible for free prekindergarten
  - 4-year-olds
  - Average daily attendance

# General Recommendations Regarding the 15%

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In implementing the high-quality prekindergarten components referenced in Rider 78, districts/charters should:

- Implement the high-quality prekindergarten components (TEC 29.167 - 29.172)
- Plan ahead
- Develop a way to document the 15% expenditures

# High-Quality Component: Curriculum

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In implementing the high-quality prekindergarten components referenced in Rider 78, school districts/charters should select and implement a curriculum that:

- Is aligned to the Texas Prekindergarten Guidelines
- Recommendation: Use curriculum listed on the Currently Adopted Instructional Materials List

# 15%: Curriculum

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Implementing expenditures included in 15%:

- Costs associated with curriculum implementation, i.e. curricular kits/collections, games and teacher guides
- Curricular support materials/equipment, i.e. books, manipulatives and classroom furniture
- Supplemental curriculum

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# High-Quality Component: Student Progress Monitoring (PK)

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In implementing the high-quality prekindergarten components referenced in Rider 78, districts/charters should:

- Use a tool on *Commissioner's List of Approved Prekindergarten Assessment Instruments 2017-2021*
- Measure the five (5) primary domains of development
  - Emergent Literacy – Reading
  - Emergent Literacy – Writing
  - Language and Communication
  - Health and Wellness
  - Mathematics
- Upload BOY and EOY data annually to PIEMS/ECDS. It is recommended that student progress monitoring is completed three (3) times a year - BOY, MOY and EOY

## The Commissioner's List of Approved Prekindergarten Assessment Instruments

When evaluating student progress and learning to guide instruction and remediation, it is recommended that educators assess multiple domains of development including reading, writing, math, health-wellness and language-communication.

- Use a tool on *Commissioner's List of Approved Kindergarten Assessment Instruments 2017-2021*
- Measure Emergent Literacy – Reading
- Recommendation: Use a multidimensional tool that measures:
  - Emergent Literacy – Reading
  - Emergent Literacy - Writing
  - Language and Communication
  - Health and Wellness
  - Mathematics

# 15%: Student Progress Monitoring

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Implementing expenditures included in 15%:

- Costs associated with implementing student progress monitoring, i.e. tool charges per student and printing costs
- Substitute costs to allow teachers to conduct student progress monitoring
- Technology tools/equipment to conduct student progress monitoring

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# Summary of Teacher Qualifications

Options	Appropriately certified to teach early childhood	Additional Qualification
Option #1	Yes	Has a Child Development Associate Credential (CDA)
Option #2	Yes	Has a Montessori certification
Option #3	Yes	Has taught for at least 8 years in a nationally accredited child care program
Option #4	Yes	Has a degree in ECE, Special Education–ECE or a non-ECE degree with 15 units of ECE-specific coursework
Option #5	Yes	Completion of TSR – Comprehensive Program
Option #6	Yes	Has completed 150 hours of professional development in ECE-specific topics; 75 of the 150 hours being in a mentoring/coaching relationship
Option #7	Yes	Completes 30 hours of ECE-specific professional development annually with 15 of the 30 hours being in a mentoring/coaching relationship until 150 hours are documented

# 15%: Teacher Qualifications and PD

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Implementing expenditures included in 15%:

- Costs associated with achieving or maintaining an "additional qualification," i.e. costs associated with getting a CDA, etc.
- Costs associated with any early childhood education-specific professional development done for prekindergarten teachers and/or paraprofessionals
- Costs associated with implementing prekindergarten mentoring/coaching as part of the district's/charter's prekindergarten professional development activities, i.e. training of prekindergarten mentors/coaches and salaries of prekindergarten mentors/coaches

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# High-Quality Component: Teacher to Student Ratio

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In implementing the high-quality prekindergarten components referenced in Rider 78, districts/charters should:

- attempt to maintain an average ratio in any prekindergarten program class of not less than one certified teacher or teacher's aide for each 11 students.

# 15%: Teacher-to-Student Ratio

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Implementing expenditures included in 15%:

- The portion of all prekindergarten paraprofessional salaries that are paid for by FSP funding for eligible 4-year-olds

Please note: Pre-existing prekindergarten teachers' salaries should not be counted as part of the 15% referenced in Rider 78.

# Six Components of a Family Engagement Plan

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- Facilitate a family-to-family support
- Establish a network of community resources
- Increase family participation in decision-making
- Equip families with tools to enhance and extend learning
- Develop staff skills in evidence-based practices that support families in meeting their children's learning benchmarks
- Evaluate family engagement efforts and use evaluations for continuous improvement

# 15%: Family Engagement

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Implementing expenditures included in 15%:

- Costs associated with prekindergarten family engagement activities, i.e. meeting costs, speaker costs and printing costs
- Family engagement personnel salaries (prekindergarten family engagement should be sole job responsibility)

- select and implement appropriate methods for evaluating the district's prekindergarten program classes by measuring student progress; and
- make data from the results of program evaluations available to parents

# 15%: Program Evaluation

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Implementing expenditures included in 15%:

- Costs associated with conducting a program evaluation, i.e. meeting costs and printing costs
- Costs associated with a 3rd party evaluator
- Costs associated with informing parents of the results of the program evaluation, i.e. meeting costs and printing costs

# High Quality Component: Data Reporting

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In implementing the high-quality prekindergarten components referenced in Rider 78, districts/charters should upload the following data in PEIMS/ECDS:

- Demographic data
- Enrollment in half-day and/or full-day prekindergarten
- Sources of funding for prekindergarten classrooms
- Class size
- Instructional staff-to-student ratio
- Type of curriculum
- Student progress monitoring tool and results
- Kindergarten readiness data
- Teacher qualifications
- Family Engagement Plan

# 15%: Data Reporting

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There are no recommended expenditures associated with data reporting.
